16-18 Help towards the cost of study | 2022 - 2023

If you are over 16 and under 19 on the 31st August, or under 24 and have an EHCP plan, you may be eligible for financial support to help with the costs associated with your study.

Support can include financial assistance for items such as travel costs, food and kit and uniform needed for the course.

Applications are assessed on an individual basis. If you turn 19 during your programme of study, you will continue to be supported to the end of the academic year in which you turn 19, or to the end of your programme of study, whichever is soonest.

TRAVEL PASSES

The College provides a FREE Transdev travel pass if your household income is less than £35,000. A subsidised travel pass is available to all 16-18 year old students whose annual household income exceeds £35,000.

Passes can be used anytime, including evenings, weekends, half terms and summer holidays!

FRFF MFALS

To be eligible for Free Meals you or your parent's household income must be £16,190 or less which can be evidenced by receipt of one or more of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- · Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (but must not be in receipt of Working Tax Credit)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- In receipt of Universal Credit with net earnings of up to and including £7400 (£616.67 per month).

Learners in the defined vulnerable groups will be eligible for a bursary of up to £1,200 for courses that run for 30 weeks or more (pro-rata for courses that run for less than 30 weeks a year).

Vulnerable groups entitled to this bursary:

- In care
- Care leavers
- Receiving Income Support, or Universal Credit because they are financially supporting themselves or financially supporting themselves and someone who is dependent on them and living with them such as a child or partner
- Receiving Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in their own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in their own right.

CARE TO LEARN

Care to Learn is a Government scheme to help young parents with childcare costs whilst studying. You may be able to claim 'Care to Learn' funding if you are under 20 years of age and need help with child care costs. For further details visit the government website: https://www.gov.uk/care-to-learn

DISCRETIONARY BURSARIES

If you are not eligible for bursary under any of these categories you may be able to apply for a Discretionary bursary. These are awarded in exceptional circumstances on a case by case basis. Support available may include travel, bus passes, food, books, uniform and equipment.

HOW TO APPLY

You can apply on the College's online secure portal 'Pay My Student' by logging on to https://nelson.paymystudent.com using your College Office 365 login details. Early applications are recommended as funds are limited and demand is always high.
